For over 18 years she has focused her efforts on water quality, mining contamination clean-up, and water-treatment. She has a lifelong commitment to environmental stewardship and has experience in groundwater monitoring, watershed health, and community participatory-based research. She believes that land and Indigenous people are inextricably linked and that sustainable land management must include Indigenous perspectives. In 2018, Souta was chosen for a Boldly Better Roddenberry Fellowship to pursue her interactive map of social, environmental and climate injustices. A graduate of the University of Montana and the University of Phoenix, Souta holds a BA in Environmental Studies-Water Resources and an MA in Innovative Leadership and Change Management.
